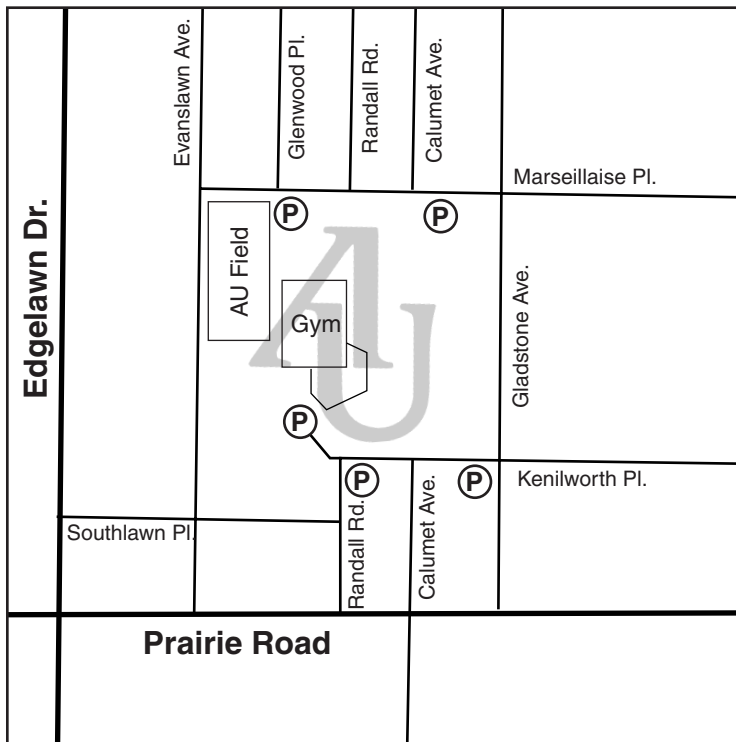
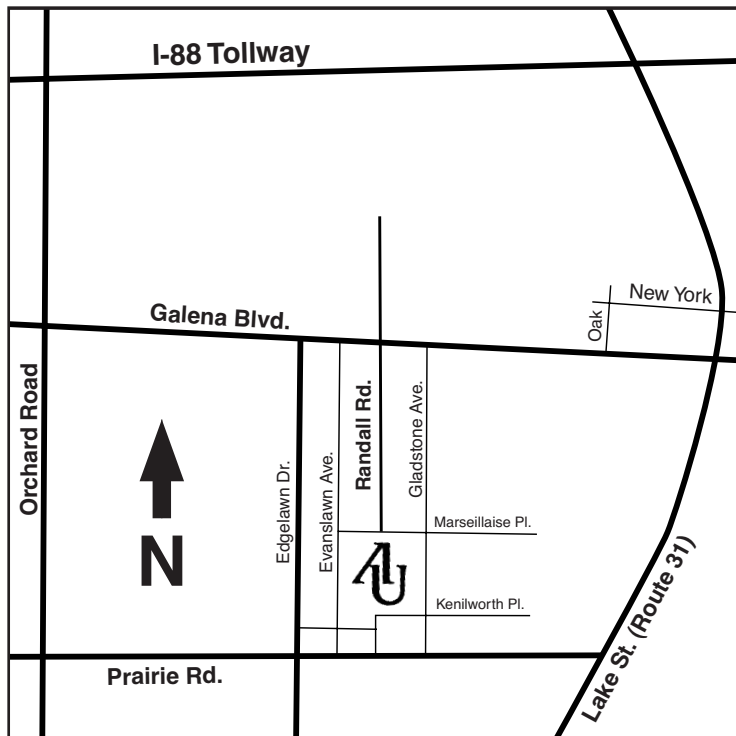

Meet the Head Coach



PETE WATKINS
Head Coach
22-14-6 (.595)
Third Season

Pete Watkins enters his third season at the helm of the Spartan men's soccer program. In his first two seasons at Aurora University, the Spartans have compiled a 22-14-6 record.

The 2003 squad qualified for the Northern Illinois-Iowa Conference (NIIC) Tournament and earned a place in the semi-finals. In the record-setting 2004 campaign, AU finished unbeaten in the NIIC, claiming both the regular season and NIIC Tournament Championships. The 2004 squad also claimed the first National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) regional rankings since 1997. Watkins was named the 2004 NIIC Coach of the Year, and the Spartans landed six athletes on the NIIC First and Second Teams.

Watkins came to AU from west Michigan, where he was the Head Women's Soccer Coach at Ferris State University, an NCAA Division II institution. He also was a West Michigan Olympic Development Program Staff Coach for the '88 boys' teams. Watkins also served as the Grand Valley Premier Coach for the U-18 men's squad competing in the National "Y" League, the highest level in boys' club soccer. In the summers, Watkins is a staff member for the Indiana University Soccer Camp, one of the top clinics in the nation for college-bound soccer players.

Prior to his five-year tenure in Michigan, Watkins was the Head Women's Coach at Northwestern State University, an NCAA Division I institution in Natchitoches, La. While at NSU, Watkins was named the 1998 Southland Conference Coach of the Year.

As a student-athlete, Watkins played for MacMurray College in Jacksonville, Ill., and earned First-Team, All-St. Louis Intercollegiate Athletic Conference honors in 1993. He was also named an Adidas Academic All-American. While at MacMurray, Watkins competed as a starting midfielder in the 1992 NCAA Division III Men's Soccer Tournament. He completed his playing career as a team captain and earned MacMurray's Bill Wall Award for Athletic Leadership. Watkins served as Assistant Coach while completing his undergraduate degree, graduating summa cum laude in psychology.

Coach Watkins earned his NSCAA Advanced National diploma. He is married to Laura, a special education teacher in Oswego, and the couple has two children, Campbell James and Mae McLain.

2005 Spartans Roundup



When the 2005 AU men's soccer team steps on the field, they will attempt to repeat the success of the 2004 campaign, when the Spartans were 15-3-4 and captured the Northern Illinois-Iowa Conference (NIIC) championship.

With a substantial core of returning student-athletes, the 2005 squad aims to use the experience gained by the current junior and sophomore classes. "This season's juniors and sophomores have significant experience in key games as freshmen," Head Coach Pete Watkins said.

Watkins, entering his third season this fall, has a 22-14-6 overall record and 7-3-0 in NIIC competition. The 2004 AU squad captured the NIIC title in a double-overtime shootout against NIIC juggernaut Dominican University. AU also had key victories over regional opponents from the Lake Michigan Conference (NIIC and LMC will merge following 2005 season) (Wisconsin Lutheran and Lakeland), CCIW (North Central College), Midwest Conference (Monmouth College and Grinnell College) and Iowa Intercollegiate (Dubuque University).

The 2005 Spartans boast only one senior; goalkeeper **Jeff Bishop** (Norridge, Ill./Harper C.C.). Bishop is a transfer and did not see significant playing time in his first season at AU.

The most unique element of the AU team this season is the experienced junior class, many of whom played a significant role in the team's improvement as freshmen and sophomores. Local standouts **Alex DeGurian** (Aurora, Ill./Neuqua Valley), **Rob Michaels** (Hinckley, Ill./Hinckley-

Big Rock) and **Amador Contreras** (Aurora, Ill./Central Catholic) all had key playing time over the past two years.

DeGurian was a NIIC First Team All-Conference and First Team All-Region selection in 2004. **Taylor Kilcrease** (Wichita Falls, Texas/Rider), **Jeff Horst** (Greenville, Mich./Greenville) and **Mike Skupien** (Western Springs, Ill./Carthage College) made major contributions, playing with composure and a high level of experience. Junior transfer **Brad Johns** (Aurora, Ill./Butler University) brings experience to the Spartan defense after spending his first two collegiate seasons at Division I Butler University.

The talented sophomore class had a big impact on the Aurora University men's soccer program. **Tyler Klotz** (Big Rock, Ill./Hinckley-Big Rock), **Jordan Barry** (Decatur, Ill./St. Teresa), **Marshall Reed** (Otsego, Mich./Otsego), **Scott Anderson** (West Dundee, Ill./Jacobs), **Jody Hall** (Sugar Grove, Ill./Bartlett) and **Phil Tedford** (Morris, Ill./Morris) all played significant roles for the AU offense last season. Reed scored seven goals and tallied four assists for 18 points. Klotz scored six goals, five assists and 17 points, while Jody Hall had four goals and three assists for 11 points. As a group, the sophomores scored 21 goals and dished out 13 assists for 55 points.

"We need to remain a balanced scoring squad to defend our NIIC title. We lost two key players, but that provides an opportunity for Tyler Klotz, Marshall Reed, Jordan Barry and Amador Contreras to step up," said Watkins.

2005 Spartans Roundup

Last year, one of the most-improved areas for the Spartans was the defensive corps. **Drew Taylor** (DeKalb, Ill./DeKalb) settled into the AU backline seamlessly and captured NIIC Newcomer of the Year honors and First Team All-Conference. **Jim Spann** (Park Ridge, Ill./Maine South), a NIIC First Team All-Conference selection, proved he could handle the job as a stalwart for the Spartan defense. **Joey Catrino** (Valparaiso, Ind./Valparaiso) and **Lance Austin** (Otsego, Mich./Otsego) were significant contributors to the AU defense and proved to be vital assets in securing the championship.

“Our leadership in goal is a key. Senior **Jeff Bishop** and freshmen **Jon Unruh** (St. Joseph, Mo./Central) and **Tyler Italiano** (St. Louis) are deadlocked in the competition to start. Both freshmen come from top-flight clubs, where they have significant experience at a high level,” Watkins mentioned.

The freshman class boasts two players from Peoria Notre Dame, the Illinois Class A State Championship team: Forward

Chase Corricelli (Peoria, Ill.) was the leading scorer with 26 goals as a senior, and backer **Brian Barnett** (Peoria, Ill.) brings talent and experience to the Spartan defense. Other newcomers to the 2005 Spartans are **Jon Sample** (Naperville, Ill./Neuqua Valley), **Adam Prevost** (Hinckley, Ill./Hinckley-Big Rock), **Jared Shavrnock** (Millington, Mich./Lakeville), **Rich Sylvester** (Roscommon, Mich./Roscommon), **Matt Wasowicz** (Moberly, Mo./Moberly), **Akira J. Host** (Chicago/Yokuta HS – Japan), **Sam Kilani** (Westmont, Ill./Hinsdale Central), **Ricardo Gallegos** (Chicago/Prosser), **Eric Main** (Millington, Mich./Millington) and **Winston McCauley** (Bloomington, Ill./Winston-Salem State).

Watkins added, “Our guys should compete internally during the week and then compete as a united force 20 times a year. For us to step up to our top regional competition—UW-Whitewater, Wheaton College, Loras College, Centre College and Principia—we must remain a family.”

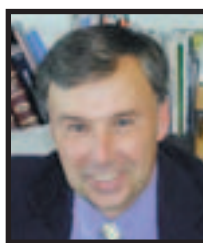
Andrew Manion Provost

Mark Walsh was named Director of Athletics in 1998. Previously, Walsh was AU's Head Baseball Coach from 1992-2002 and Assistant Coach from 1987-1992. Walsh led the Spartans to nine NIIC Conference Championships and nine NCAA Tournament appearances while posting a 320-85 (.790) won-lost record in 10 seasons. Walsh also served as Assistant Football Coach at AU from 1986-1996 and was part of the coaching staff who reinstated football after it had been dropped in 1952. Walsh earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Aurora University.

This Is Aurora University

Aurora University traces its origins to the 1893 founding of a seminary in the small town of Mendota, Ill. Though established initially to prepare graduates for ministry, the institution soon adopted a broader mission and moved to a new campus on the western edge of the nearby community of Aurora. With this change came a different name and a growing enrollment. In 1985, the institution was rechristened Aurora University.

In 1992, the Aurora and George Williams College traditions blended when the two institutions entered into the affiliation agreement that paved the way for a merger eight years later.

Today Aurora University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association to award degrees at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels. The institution enrolls approximately 4,000 degree-seeking students a year on its Illinois and Wisconsin campuses. AU offers its undergraduates a wide range of on- and off-campus learning experiences. Students participate in more than 40 musical, literary, religious, social and service organizations and play active roles in campus governance. The university also fields 18 NCAA Division III intercollegiate athletic teams. The Spartans boast a winning tradition with 37 conference titles in recent years and 32 regular appearances in national tournaments.

The Alumni Hall of Physical Education features a racquetball court, climbing wall, complete locker-room facilities, training room, weight room, aerobic-activities room, classroom and coaches' offices.

At AU, we believe that the educational needs of students are served best through the formation of strategic partnerships with institutions of like vision, mission and values. Such collaborations also enhance the well being of the communities around our campus. For example, our innovative partnership with the West Aurora School District is recognized nationally as a model for educational reform. Opening this year is AU's \$14 million Institute for Collaboration that will house this growing collaboration and the students and faculty it nurtures. Our George Williams Campus at Williams Bay, Wis., is also the scene for important collaborative efforts. Last year, the residential, conference and academic facility, developed in partnership with Children's Oncology Services Inc., opened. In the years ahead, the new building will serve as the home to the *One Step At A Time* Camp for children with cancer and the university's rapidly growing academic program.

Aurora University is located in west Aurora, within an hour's drive of Chicago and at the western end of the Illinois Research and Development Corridor. It is accessible via Interstate 88 at the Orchard Road exit.
