




Meet the Head Coach



MICHELLE ROOF Head Coach Fourth Season

Coach Roof is entering her fourth season as coach of the AU women's basketball team, where she has compiled a record of 44-35. In her first two seasons, Roof led a dramatic turnaround in the team's success. In 2005-

2006, Roof's Spartans finished 14-13, doubling their wins from the previous season. The 2006-2007 season was even better for the Spartans as they finished the year with a 17-9 record, good enough for a second place tie in the inaugural year of the Northern Athletics Conference. Last year's campaign was similar to her first, as Roof guided a freshman-dominated team to a 13-13 record overall, including an 11-7 finish in the NAC.

Prior to her one-year stint at Lewis University as an assistant, Roof spent two years as an assistant at Saint Mary's University (MN) and one season at Grinnell College (IA). While at St. Mary's, she directed the "Lil' Cardinals" youth basketball club and clinics.

Roof played two seasons at Eastern Illinois University (Division I) before spending a season as a student assistant coach for the Panthers. She also was a student assistant at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse for one season.

A member of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA), Roof has worked several national camps, including University of Tennessee, Doug Bruno-DePaul Basketball Camps, Syracuse University, Texas Tech University and University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Roof received her Bachelor of Science degree in physical education in 2001 from Eastern Illinois University.



Meet the Assistant Coaches



TIM KOHN Assistant Coach Second Season

Dr. Tim Kohn, "Coach K," enters his second season as an assistant coach for the Spartans. Kohn has an extensive coaching background at the high school and AAU levels, beginning his coaching

career in 1988. Kohn most recently coached for the Illinois Valley Starz AAU Girls' Basketball program. During his threeyear stint with the Illinois Valley Starz, seven of his players went on to play basketball at the college level.

Kohn's previous coaching stops include Plano High School, Newark High School, St. Edward Central Catholic High School (Elgin) and Ottawa Marquette High School. While at Ottawa Marquette, "Coach K" guided his Lady Crusaders squad to an 18-win season, most in school history at that time and a regional championship.

"Tim is a great addition to our staff, bringing to AU a vast amount of coaching knowledge, experience and success as a head coach. He has a true passion for coaching and brings great ideas and enthusiasm to the program," said Coach Roof.

Kohn has a doctorate and bachelor of science degree from Northern Illinois University. He and his wife, Annette, live in Ottawa with their daughter, Jaci Kohn.

HEATHER GUETSCHOW Assistant Coach Second Season

Heather Guetschow returns to Aurora University as an assistant coach for the Spartans. She was a student-assistant coach for AU in the 2004-2005 season.



Prior to returning to AU, Guetschow was a part of the Dundee-Crown High School girl's basketball staff as a sophomore girl's coach in 2006-2007 and a freshman girl's coach in 2005-2006.

Guetschow was a two-sport standout for the Spartans during her playing career (2000-2004), excelling both on the soccer field and hardwood for AU. While at AU, she played on six conference championship teams and competed in four NCAA tournaments.

"I have wanted Heather on my staff since I accepted the head coaching position here. She was a great player and leader while a student-athlete at AU, and has gained valuable coaching experience at a top high school program. Heather understands the winning tradition at Aurora University and knows what it takes to achieve it. She will be an outstanding mentor for our players," said Coach Roof.

Guetschow has a bachelor of arts degree in physical education from Aurora University.



PAUL WAITKOSS Assistant Coach First Season

Paul Waitkoss enters his first season with the Spartans. Waitkoss has coached girls' basketball and softball at various schools in Illinois, including Putnam County High School, Newark High

School, Rosary High School and Hinckley-Big Rock High School. He also served as the head baseball coach at Hinckley-Big Rock.

He currently works as a special education teacher at Somonauk High School. He has also taught in Putnam County, West Aurora, Oswego and Newark School Districts in addition to Rosary High School.

"Coach Paul has been around the game of basketball for a lot of years. He specializes in full and half court zone defenses and will be especially helpful with our trapping schemes. I look forward to the different ideas and philosophies he will bring to our program," said Head Coach Michelle Roof.

Waitkoss has a bachelor of science degree in history from Rockford College.

2008-2009 Season Preview



The Aurora University women's basketball team led by Head Coach Michelle Roof looks to propel themselves to the top of the Northern Athletics Conference standings in the 2008-2009 season. Coach Roof is entering her fourth season as the women's basketball coach and has tallied a 44-35 record. The 2007-2008 Spartans were 13-13 with an 11-7 record in the NAC.

Three key players to the Spartans 2007-2008 season graduated this past May: Kisha Miller, Lexi Pioli and Rachael Blanton. Miller, a point guard, led the team's with 72 assists. She was also the teams fourth leading scorer averaging 6.5 points per game. Pioli, also a guard, played in 24 games for Coach Roof and was a vital bench player. Blanton played in 25 games and started 10 while averaging 4.0 points per game and 2.7 rebounds per game.

The 2008-2009 Spartans are a young group that will need to follow the guidance of their few upper-classmen in order to make a run for the NAC Championship. Two seniors return for the Spartans: Meagan Re (Belvidere, IL) and Kim Voiles (Garden Prairie, IL). Re was named to the All-Northern Athletics Conference Honorable Mention Team in the 2007-2008 season. Re started every game for the Spartans and averaged 10.8 points per game and 4.4 rebounds. She also led the team with 30 three-point field goals and 63 steals. Voiles led the Spartans in minutes played (794), rebounds (208) and points (295). Both of these senior athletes will need to keep up their stellar play in order to help the team be successful this season. Even though Re and Voiles are the only seniors on the team, the Spartans have a group of talented young women who have college basketball experience. Sophomore Michelle Perry (Maywood, IL) played in all 26 games for the Spartans last season. Perry averaged 9.5 points per game and 5.7 rebounds per game. Her inside presence will be tough for opposing teams to defend. Sophomore guard Ashley Daniels (Waukegan, IL) played in 25 games last season and started 18 of them. Daniels averaged 6.3 points per game and led the team with 72 assists. Sophomore Jessica Mason (Crystal Lake, IL) played in all 26 games averaging 3.3 points per game. Other players who saw significant time playing time were sophomores Angela Ozanic (Woodstock, IL) and Liz Pearlman (Chicago, IL).



The coaches of the Northern Illinois-Iowa Conference (formerly known as the Northern Illinois Intercollegiate Conference) selected an Aurora University athlete as the NIIC's women's basketball Player of the Year for seven consecutive years. The string began with Cathy Flanagan, a junior, in 1990-1991 and continued with Sona Bedenian (who also won the award as a junior in 1991-1992), Jennifer Gabel (winning as a sophomore in 1991-1992) and freshman Dana Lettow in 1993-1994, Gabel again as a senior (1995-1996), and Lettow three-peating as a junior and senior in 1995-1996 and 1996-1997. During those seven years, the Spartans were 58-12 in NIIC play and won four titles (along with three second-place finishes).

By the time **Dana Lettow** completed her AU career in 1996-1997, she left as the most prolific player in Spartan history. Some of her career highlights include

AU's all-time scoring leader (1,693 points.); two-time Kodak All-American; Columbus Multimedia and Division III News All-American; three-time All-Region; four-year All-NIIC; three-time NIIC Player of the Year; AU single game scoring record (41 points.); four-time AU team Most Valuable Player; double-digit




scoring in 85 of 94 career games; 36 games with 20 plus points; and led the team in scoring in 66 of 94 games (70%).

In recognition of her achievements, her #40 was retired by Aurora University President Dr. Thomas H. Zarle immediately after her final game on February 25,

1997, joining former NBA star Mickey Johnson as the only other AU athlete to have his number retired.





Aurora University traces its origins to the 1893 founding of a seminary in the small town of Mendota, IL. Though established initially to prepare graduates for ministry, the institution soon adopted a broader mission and moved to a new campus on the western edge of the nearby community of Aurora. With this change came a different name and a growing enrollment. In 1985, the institution was rechristened Aurora University.

In 1992, the Aurora and George Williams College traditions blended when the two institutions entered into the affiliation agreement that paved the way for a merger eight years later.

Today Aurora University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association to award degrees at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels. The institution enrolls approximately 4,300 degree-seeking students a year on its Illinois and Wisconsin campuses.

The Aurora campus offers undergraduate and graduate programs through the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Education (including the School of Physical Education) and the College of Professional Studies (including the Dunham School of Business, School of Nursing and School of Social Work, The graduate programs offer areas of specialization, leading to master's degrees in business administration, recreation administration, teaching and social work, as well as a doctorate in education.

At AU, academic programs are enhanced through learning opportunities. The Dunham Scholars Program incorporates service learning and extracurricular activities into its business curriculum. The Honors Program offers students advanced coursework, innovative seminars and participation in special events. May Term is a three-week program offering opportunities to study abroad, research a science topic on campus or travel to Chicago to explore the city's culture.

AU offers its undergraduates a wide range of on- and off-campus learning experiences. Students participate in more than 60 musical, literary, religious, social and service organizations and play active roles in campus governance. The university also fields18 NCAA Division III intercollegiate athletic teams. The Spartans boast a winning tradition with 44 conference titles in recent years and 27 regular appearances in national tournaments.

The Alumni Hall of Physical Education features a racquetball court, climbing wall, complete locker room facilities, training room, weight room, aerobic-activities room, classroom and coaches' offices.

Aurora University is located in west Aurora, within an hour's drive of Chicago and at the western end of the Illinois Research and Development Corridor. It is accessible via Interstate 88 at the Orchard Road exit. When you can't attend games, catch ALL the scores on the
