### BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN ORGANIZATIONAL LEADERSHIP

The Organizational Leadership program at the George Williams Campus of Aurora University in Williams Bay, WI provides a degree which synthesizes knowledge from diverse fields into a focused yet flexible plan of study that is useful to leadership in all forms of social organization. The program is designed for the student whose professional goal is a generalist leadership position in corporate, government, not-for-profit, or community organizations.

Completion of the program requires a minimum of 120 semester hours; a maximum of 68 credits can be transferred from CLC. Credit earned at previous colleges with a grade of at least C- is transferable if it is non-technical in nature, is comparable to credit offered at Aurora University, or is generally considered applicable to programs such as those offered by the University. Transfer students must hold a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0. CLC students holding a transfer-oriented associate degree (AA or AS) may have met all lower-division general education requirements for a bachelor's degree from Aurora University. In addition, AU requires the successful completion of an approved 3000 level general education writing intensive course and successful completion of a senior capstone. Aurora University participates in the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI).

The following courses are recommended for College of Lake County students wishing to fulfill Aurora University's George Williams Campus General Education requirements. Additional courses which meet the General Education requirements will also be applied to the appropriate category.
